Chief of Police --

Greetings to all of our Neighborhood Watch members,

Another spring is upon us. The police department is very excited about some new projects we have going to continue to work with our citizens and keep our safe community. Since I last reported to you, our yearly crime statistics have come in. I'm pleased to say that our efforts are having great results. In 2008, total crime was reduced by 20%. Even traffic crashes were down by 5%. But, more importantly, fatal crashes were down 33%. We are waiting to see if the economy is going to have an effect on crime. I am cautiously optimistic, since the first three months of 2009 have also seen a decrease. The department will continue to monitor crime trends and certainly we will notify Neighborhood Watch if things begin to shift.

As I mentioned, there are several projects under way at the police department. First, I'd like to thank Officer Kirchberger, my assistant Jean, and all the Neighborhood Watch volunteers who helped make our second annual Youth Leadership Conference a success. This is truly turning out to be something our youth look forward to. This year we reached out to the parochial schools as well which enabled us to reach more kids. I'm glad they were able to participate. I personally would like to thank Neighborhood Watch for supporting this program. In keeping with the learning theme, our Police Citizens Academy is on schedule to have its first session this fall. We will be getting out an application in July for a September start date. As I have mentioned at past meetings, I will make sure applications are available at a future meeting.

Public Safety Mobile Command Post. Once the inside is complete, we will bring it to a meeting so all can take a tour if you'd like. This vehicle will serve as a command post in the field for both police and fire, to enable us to work in a unified structure. It would be my plan in the future to use Neighborhood Watch volunteers to assist in the command post when a large situation calls for the attention of all our resources in the field. Along with increasing the department's ability to be more efficient, we are switching our radio system to 800 MHz. This will give us interoperability with not only surrounding jurisdictions, but with our own fire department.

Finally, I did submit our Menomonee Falls Block Watch for a National Award given out by the National Sheriff's Association, but they have not made their awards yet. Rest assured as soon as I hear that we've won I will let you all know! 'Till then I just want to say 'thank you' for all that you do to support your police department, your neighborhoods and your community. It is truly an honor to be your chief and run what I feel is an extremely dedicated and professional police department. Have a safe and healthy summer.

Spring BRUSH PICK-UP



The MF Public Works Department
is once again scheduling a spring brush pick-up for
Monday, May 18, 2009

We cannot extend the pick-up, or pick up brush
that is put out after the

deadline on **Sunday, May 17th**

Please follow these rules to help us with this year's brush pick-up:

1. Brush materials acceptable for Village pick-up are branches up to six inches in diameter, cut to a maximum length of four feet.
2. Brush must be placed on the terrace area (between curb and sidewalk). In areas without curb, brush should be placed on the grass area adjacent to the street pavement or adjacent to driveway entrances.
3. For safety reasons NO brush may be placed on the street pavement.
4. **PLEASE NOTE:** Yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves and garden debris **WILL NOT** be picked up.
5. **NO** stumps, roots or shrubs with intact root balls will be picked up.
6. Any yard waste that is mixed in with your branches **WILL NOT BE PICKED UP**.
7. Brush in containers **WILL NOT** be picked up, as too often there is yard waste in the bottom. We encourage you to use your Yard Waste Permit and take yard waste debris (not picked up) to the Orchard Ridge Landfill.

Your cooperation with this brush pick-up is appreciated. Thank You from the MFPW.

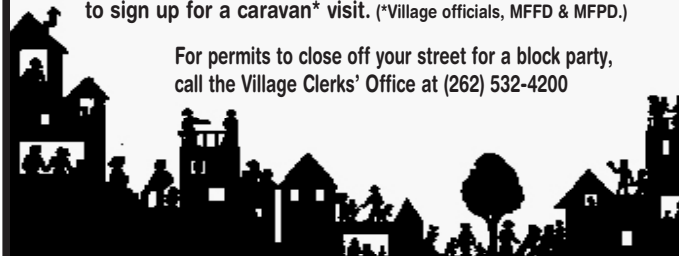
